For 2010-2011, Bemis Junior High School made Adequate Yearly Progress (AYP) in English Language Arts and Mathematics. Our school enjoyed a very successful year and we greatly appreciate the support from our parents, staff, and community. The reports below demonstrate our commitment to student achievement and the continuous improvement in our planning efforts.

School Improvement Plan

Bemis Junior High School's Tier II Indicators:

Increase the number of 7th and 8th grade students who score a proficiency level of 1 or 2 on the Mathematics portion of the Michigan Educational Assessment Program.

Increase the number of 7th and 8th grade students who score a proficiency level 1 or 2 on the Reading portion of the Michigan Educational Assessment Program.

Increase the number of 7th grade students who score a proficiency level 1 or 2 on the Writing portion of the Michigan Educational Assessment Program. Increase the number of 7th and 8th grade students who score proficient or higher on the school writing assessment.

Bemis Junior High School's Tier III Indicators:

Bemis Junior High School had a successful 2010-2011 school year. Students showed measurable growth in meeting the rigorous goals that staff set for student achievement, based on the UCS Indicators of Excellence School Improvement Plan and our school's Tier II goals.

Bemis Junior High School's data teams utilized a variety of resources to analyze data, including DataDirector, MEAP summary reports, Golden Package, and district benchmark and classroom

assessments. Teachers met on regular basis with the principal in grade-level data teams to analyze data and assist in planning classroom lessons and intervention strategies.

Bemis Junior High School's goals were developed as an outgrowth of our Tier II indicators. These indicator goals, in the areas of Mathematics, Reading and Writing specify proficiency targets for all Bemis Junior High School students. The number of our 8th grade students who scored proficient or higher, as measured by the fall 2010 MEAP, increased in all areas assessed. In the area of Mathematics, our 7th grader's proficiency level remained the same as the previous year at a level of 91% proficiency. 88% of 8th grader's are proficient in the Mathematics MEAP, which is a 6% increase over last year's proficiency levels. The percentage of 7th graders who met proficiency levels on the Reading MEAP assessment declined by 4%. Despite this decline, we remain in the top third within the district and above the state average in 7th grade MEAP Mathematics proficiency levels. Our 8th graders who scored proficient in Reading increased by 2% to a 92% proficiency rate, which is the highest Reading proficiency score among Junior High Schools in Utica Community Schools. Our 7th grade student's writing proficiency was assessed on the MEAP this year after a one year hiatus of the written assessment portion of the MEAP. This year's proficiency level of 63% served as a baseline for the development of the student's writing as we continued with our building-wide writing plan for both grades. We used grade specific writing prompts and a common ACT Writing Rubric to score the writing samples. Our plan remains to integrate the regular education curriculums and pacing guides to direct daily instruction for all students and to continue to provide co-taught class support for our students with disabilities.

This past year we provided academic support for our students through three different after school enrichment programs. STRIVE is an hour long teacher led support class that met twice weekly. This year we had a new program where students from Henry Ford II High School provided all subject tutoring and mentoring to our students on Tuesday and Thursday afternoons. Finally, during the last quarter of this school year, we offered additional, weekly, math support in the form of a Math Club which assisted 18 students in their preparation for their end of course exams.

We are preparing for another year of academic success at Bemis Junior High School to continue the tradition of academic excellence and high student achievement.

Points of Pride

At Bemis Junior High School we are proud to announce that this year we have 223 Honor Roll Students (all A's or A average) and 490 with a B average and higher). The Social Studies Olympiad team represented Bemis well with one team earning third in the State of Michigan competition. The 8th grade Yearbook class earned the Partnership in Excellence Award for meeting all deadlines. Fifteen Bemis drafting students competed in the Michigan Industrial Technology Education Society, (MITES), competition. Twenty-four projects advanced to the state level where Bemis took 1st place in 6 of the 10 categories entered. Twenty-one of the 26 projects achieved 1st, 2nd, or 3rd place awards. The Bemis Science Olympiad Team won 6th place at the Regional Science Olympiad competition. Ten Bemis band students participated in the Solo and Ensemble Festival and earned medals. Six Bemis students qualified for the Michigan School Band and Orchestra Association Honors Band. Five Bemis students received awards for their artwork and participation in the Utica Community Schools Arts Festival. The Student Council canned food drive gathered close to 4,000 cans for local families. Bemis Student Council donated over \$200.00 to the Relay for Life and the Foundation for Children with Cancer. Students donated; over 200 blankets to Project Linus, hundreds of used books to local elementary schools, Easter dinner items to Samaritan House, along with egg dye kits. Over 200 pairs of pants to Teens for Jeans, to benefit homeless teens at the Detroit Rescue Mission, dozens of gifts to Toys for Tots at Christmas, \$400 from the Great American Bake sale and finally, used eyeglasses to The Lions Club "Recycle for Sight" program. With the support of the Ecology Club and student body, Bemis Jr. High earned recognition as a Michigan Green School.

Student Enrollment

Students attend Bemis Junior High School based on the attendance areas serviced by our school community. A number of Utica students in other attendance areas enroll in our school based on the district's open enrollment process and non-resident students may attend through the Schools of Choice program.

Specialized Programs

Utica Center for Math, Science and Technology

The Utica Center for Mathematics, Science and Technology is designed to bring advanced students with special talents and interests together with leading-edge technology. The Center utilizes an advanced curriculum for grades 9-12 which serves to inspire, challenge, and prepare students to pursue careers in mathematics and science. The Center follows the Utica tradition of providing the finest instruction and innovation. Students are selected based on their academic record and performance on tests of aptitude and achievement.

Utica Academy for International Studies

This is a four-year high school academy designed to prepare students for completion of the International Baccalaureate (IB) Diploma Program. All students are expected to take part in artistic activities (*creativity*); sports or physical activity (*action*); and community or social service projects (*service*). This unique curriculum and the personal growth it requires of its students will provide them a mobility and adaptability that prepare students to successfully lead in the global workforce of the 21st century.

Utica Center for Science and Industry

The Center for Science and Industry is a half day shared time program that provides 9th through 12th grade students with a variety of cutting-edge Career and Technology Education taught in an integrated manner. Along with core math and English classes, students select from electives which will support one of three career strands: 1) Engineering and Technology, 2) Mechatronics, or 3) Multi-Media Technology. The CSI is project based and provides students with a wide array of experiences with professionals from business and industrial partners.

Project CLIME (Critical Language Initiative in Mandarin Education)

Project CLIME is focused on developing a strategic initiative to promote a K-12 foreign language program within Utica Community Schools. The goal will be accomplished by establishing a grades K-6 partial immersion Mandarin program at Oakbrook Elementary School feeding into a 7-12 secondary target language program housed at Heritage Junior High School, Stevenson High School and the Utica Academy for International Studies.

Core Curriculum

All the schools in Utica Community Schools offer students a comprehensive and rigorous academic program that meets and exceeds all state and federal standards. Our schools continue to follow the Michigan Grade Level Content Expectations (GLCE) and the Michigan High School Content Expectations (HSCE) and are aligning the expectations with the Common Core State Standards. District Assessments

Utica Community Schools not only looks at state assessments but we go above and beyond in monitoring the progress of our students. The following assessments are also given at each of the different levels to follow each student's academic progress.

Michigan Literacy Progress Profile (MLPP) is given in grades K-6 to assess students' progress in reading comprehension, phonics and fluency.

Dynamic Indicators of Basic Early Literacy Skills (DIBELS) is used in grades K-6 to monitor a student's reading growth on a more frequent basis. These assessments are quick snapshots of a child's improvement in literacy.

EXPLORE is a preliminary ACT assessment given to all ninth grade students in Utica Community Schools to help students prepare for high school coursework, higher education and ACT success. It assesses students' skills in English, reading, mathematics and science.

Preliminary SAT/National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test (PSAT/NMSQT)

The PSAT/NMSQT is a standardized test given to all 10th graders in Utica Community Schools. It measures a student's skills in the areas of critical reading, math problem-solving and writing skills. It also gives the student a chance as an 11th grader to take the test and possibly qualify for the National Merit Scholarship program.
