For 2010-2011, Davis Junior High made Adequate Yearly Progress (AYP) in English Language Arts and Mathematics. Our school enjoyed a very successful year and we greatly appreciate the support from our parents, staff, and community. The reports below demonstrate our commitment to student achievement and the continuous improvement in our planning efforts.

## **School Improvement Plan**

### Davis Junior High School's Tier II Indicators:

-  Increase the number of students who are score at proficient or higher in math.
-  Increase the number of students who are score at proficient or higher in reading.
-  Increase the number of students who are score at proficient or higher in writing.

### Davis Junior High School's Tier III Indicators:

Davis Junior High School had a successful 2010-2011 school year. Students showed measurable growth in meeting the rigorous goals that staff set for student achievement, based on the UCS Indicators of Excellence School Improvement Plan and our school's Tier II goals.

Davis Junior High data teams utilized a variety of resources to analyze data, including DataDirector, EXPLORE and MEAP summary reports, Golden Package, and district benchmark and classroom assessments. Teachers met on regular basis with the principal in grade-level data teams to analyze data and assist in planning classroom lessons and intervention strategies.

The Davis Junior High fall of 2010 MEAP results for this year have shown growth areas in 8<sup>th</sup> grade math for all students including double digit growth for special education students. The special education students also increased in 8<sup>th</sup> grade reading, science and social studies MEAP scores. The increase in social studies proficiency rates places Davis Junior High equal with the district average and 8% points above the State of Michigan average. The Davis Junior High 8<sup>th</sup> grade science scores have increased this year to 80% proficiency with our two sub group populations displaying increase as well. The 7<sup>th</sup> grade writing scores are 5% above the State of Michigan scores.

The Davis Junior High School Improvement Team created a third Tier II indicator for the 2010-2011 school year that focused on improving students reading comprehension skills. The social studies department has taken on the role as the building wide facilitator of the reading Tier II indicator. The focus of all Cluster IV schools was centered on increasing reading comprehension of complex text. Professional development was provided for teachers on Close and Critical Reading strategies that provide students an additional strategy to unlock complex text passages.

The Tier II indicator of increasing students' writing skills has continued to show growth over the past school year. Davis Junior High has instituted three school-wide writing assessments to be administered at the beginning of the school year and again at the end the year. Additional formative assessments were administered at ten week intervals. The 7<sup>th</sup> grade students focused on increasing proficiency on Expository writing, 8<sup>th</sup> grade measured Compare and Contract writing practices and the 9<sup>th</sup> grade was provided instruction on ACT Persuasive essay style.

The Tier II indicator of increasing math proficiency has produced an increase of 6% in the 2010 MEAP scores. Teaching strategies focused on increasing the use of math manipulatives, addressing the GLCE of properties of plane and geometry figures through bell ringer activities, demonstrating multiple choice and test taking strategies and understanding graphic representations.

Results from the 2010 EXPLORE assessment has Davis students with scores at or above the district averages in Composite, Math, Science, and Reading areas. Most notable increases are in the reading scores showing 54% of Davis 9<sup>th</sup> grade students are at the college readiness standard. This score is 5% above the district average. The faculty of Davis Junior High remains committed to preparing all students to be college ready.

The Cluster IV feeder schools have identified a K-12 professional development agenda that will include a comprehensive program to develop differentiated instructional strategies. These strategies will be geared toward providing teachers additional tools to engage all students in the educational process.

### **Points of Pride**

MSBOA District XVI 2010-2011 Junior High Honors Band Celebration – Three Davis Junior High students were recognized at the January 24<sup>th</sup> Board of Education meeting for their outstanding performance at the MSBOA. Becky Sekich – Trumpet, Alex Doroslovac – Baritone, Patrick Murphy – Percussion and Band Director Scott Condne.

Scholastic Art and Writing Awards – Art teacher Pat Murphy has inspired her students to new heights. Two 7<sup>th</sup> grade students earned Gold Key awards which allowed their pieces to go onto New York for National Competition. Robbie Marshall (7 grade) Clay Sculpture-Gold Key, Anthony Dostine (8 grade) Relief Painting-Gold Key,

Davis Junior High is the first secondary school in UCS to initiate the Response to Intervention (RTI) Program for 7<sup>th</sup> grade students.

Davis Junior High was presented with the Emerald School Award. Teacher Donna Hryrnk and the Life Centered Career Education (LCCE) students have successfully taken Davis to the next level of the Green School Application process.

### **Student Enrollment**

Students attend Davis Junior High School based on the attendance areas serviced by our school community. A number of Utica students in other attendance areas enroll in our school based on the district's open enrollment process and non-resident students may attend thorough the Schools of Choice program.

### **Specialized Programs**

Utica Center for Math, Science and Technology

The Utica Center for Mathematics, Science and Technology is designed to bring advanced students with special talents and interests together with leading-edge technology. The Center utilizes an advanced curriculum for grades 9-12 which serves to inspire, challenge, and prepare students to pursue careers in mathematics and science. The Center follows the Utica tradition of providing the finest instruction and innovation. Students are selected based on their academic record and performance on tests of aptitude and achievement.

### Utica Academy for International Studies

This is a four-year high school academy designed to prepare students for completion of the International Baccalaureate (IB) Diploma Program. All students are expected to take part in artistic activities (*creativity*); sports or physical activity (*action*); and community or social service projects (*service*). This unique curriculum and the personal growth it requires of its students will provide them a mobility and adaptability that prepare students to successfully lead in the global workforce of the 21<sup>st</sup> century.

### Utica Center for Science and Industry

The Center for Science and Industry is a half day shared time program that provides 9<sup>th</sup> through 12th grade students with a variety of cutting-edge Career and Technology Education taught in an integrated manner. Along with core math and English classes, students select from electives which will support one of three career strands: 1) Engineering and Technology, 2) Mechatronics, or 3) Multi-Media Technology. The CSI is project based and provides students with a wide array of experiences with professionals from business and industrial partners.

### Project CLIME (Critical Language Initiative in Mandarin Education)

Project CLIME is focused on developing a strategic initiative to promote a K-12 foreign language program within Utica Community Schools. The goal will be accomplished by establishing a grades K-6 partial immersion Mandarin program at Oakbrook Elementary School feeding into a 7-12 secondary target language program housed at Heritage Junior High School, Stevenson High School and the Utica Academy for International Studies.

### **Core Curriculum**

All the schools in Utica Community Schools offer students a comprehensive and rigorous academic program that meets and exceeds all state and federal standards. Our schools follow the Michigan Grade Level Content Expectations (GLCE) and the Michigan High School Content Expectations (HSCE). ### **District Assessments**

Utica Community Schools not only looks at state assessments but we go above and beyond in monitoring the progress of our students. The following assessments are also given at each of the different levels to follow each student's academic progress.

**Michigan Literacy Progress Profile (MLPP)** is given in grades K-6 to assess students' progress in reading comprehension, phonics and fluency.

**Dynamic Indicators of Basic Early Literacy Skills (DIBELS)** is used in grades K-6 to monitor a student's reading growth on a more frequent basis. These assessments are quick snapshots of a child's improvement in literacy.

**EXPLORE** is a preliminary ACT assessment given to all ninth grade students in Utica Community Schools to help students prepare for high school coursework, higher education and ACT success. It assesses students' skills in English, reading, mathematics and science.

### **Preliminary SAT/National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test (PSAT/NMSQT)**

The PSAT/NMSQT is a standardized test given to all 10<sup>th</sup> graders in Utica Community Schools. It measures a student's skills in the areas of critical reading, math problem-solving and writing skills. It also gives the student a chance as an 11<sup>th</sup> grader to take the test and possibly qualify for the National Merit Scholarship program.
