What is Title I?

Intent and Purpose

- Title I is a federally-funded program that provides supplemental resources to schools that have a high percentage of students who receive free or reduced lunch (40% and above)
- The federal government passes the money to the state, which then distributes money to qualifying schools
- Jeannette qualifies for this because we are nearly 80% free and reduced lunch

What is Title I?

Schoolwide vs Targeted

- Right now, Jeannette is Targeted, but we are working towards schoolwide.
- The difference is that, when a school is targeted, funds and resources can be used only for students who fall into that 75% free and reduced lunch
- Schoolwide means that the funds and resources can be used for the entire school.

How Does JJHS Spend its Title I Allocation?

- Behavior and Restorative Facilitator
- Classroom academic signage
- Classroom academic materials
- Intervention classes in Reading and Mathematics
- Professional development for teachers
- Funding for Parent engagement events

How does Title I fit in with the School Improvement Plan (coordinated efforts)?

- Title I supports monitoring student progress and supporting high-quality instruction in the classroom
- We do this through a Comprehensive Needs Assessment, completed every year, which is part of the School/Continuous Improvement plan

What are our curriculum and resources for each subject area?

- All curricular material for all subjects can be found on the UCS website by going to uticak12.org > **Academics** > **Secondary**.
- Open House/Curriculum Night is a face-to-face opportunity for parents to learn about their child's curriculum

How are our students assessed to measure progress?

- NWEA – twice a year in English and Math, all grades
- NWEA – additional administration for Reading and Math Lab classes
- PSAT – once a year, 8th and 9th grades in English and Math
- MSTEP – once a year, 7th grade in English and Math; 8th grade in Science and Social Studies
- District mid-term and final assessments

What is our communication process with parents?

- School newsletter via emails, text message, Jeannette website, Facebook
- Parent-teacher conferences 2 times per year
- Phone calls and messages
- Patriot Parents group

What is our family/ school compact?

- Written agreement outlines how parents, school staff, and students will share the responsibility for student academic achievement
- Outlines how the school and parents will build and develop a partnership to help children achieve state standards
- Signed by parents, students, and teachers
