



IB DIPLOMA & STEM ENDORSEMENT

- Because UAIS offers 32 classes over four years, students can also earn the same STEM endorsement as MST students.
- STEM Endorsement Criteria:
 - 6 Credits of Math
 - 6 Credits of Science
 - .5 Credit in Technology (Computer Science)
 - .5 Credit in Engineering (Physics)
- STEM Endorsement is achievable at UAIS while retaining your other IB classes (ex. four years language, history, fine arts)!

Leadership has always been part of Julie Elfishawy's DNA.

"The opportunities available in the district as a whole have given me chances to become a leader, and that started from when I was at junior high," she said. "I think without these opportunities from the district, I would not be able to realize my potential as a leader."

And by taking advantage of those opportunities, doors to the Utica Community Schools senior's future are beginning to open for her.

Elfishawy, who will graduate in June from the Utica Academic for International studies, has been named semi-finalists in the Coca-Cola Scholar program – placing her among the top 1,900 students of 93,000 national applicants.

The semi-finalist status is the first part toward a \$20,000 scholarship that will ultimately be awarded to 150 graduates.

Elfishawy said the scholarship will help support a medical degree from ten possible national universities where she has applied. Her current interest is in a career in surgery.

Among her many leadership roles has been the creation of a three-day camp during the last mid-winter break that allowed junior high school students to explore an interest in medical careers.

"I think if I was able to start off students on this journey when they are young, then they would find out if they were truly passionate and that would make for better health care professionals in the future," she said.

In addition to the camp, Elfishawy also serves as vice president of the UAIS Student Advisory Board, is member of the competitive legislative debate team, state and regional finalist in the HOSA Health Professionals competition, and is a member of her church's community service group.

She is also a National Merit Scholarship Corporation Semifinalist – placing her among the top one percent of the nation's graduates – a

National AP scholar, and has earned a first place finish in state legislative debate. She has been honored for her character and commitment to service by both her church and UAIS.

"The teachers here are so supportive, and every time I have had an idea in mind – like the day camp – they help helped get me started and gave me the fuel I need in the academics and as well as beyond."



School History and Enrollment

The Utica Academy for International Studies (UAIS) opened in the fall of 2008, and is a fully authorized International Baccalaureate World School. We currently enroll 399 students in grades 9-12. Our inaugural class graduated in June 2012.

Community

UAIS is a public high school program belonging to the Utica Community Schools (UCS) district, which is Michigan's second largest school district. Located approximately 7 miles north of Detroit, in Macomb County, the 25 elementary schools, seven junior high schools, and four high schools within UCS serve approximately 30,000 students from a 66-square mile suburban area. The community is largely residential with strong economic ties to the automotive industry.

UAIS students are drawn from the four Utica Community Schools high schools. Our students are socio-economically, ethnically and religiously diverse. Approximately 16% of students qualify for free and reduced lunch.

School Schedule

We operate a two semester, eight class period A/B block schedule which allows students to earn eight credits per semester.

IB Diploma Course Load Students are advised to take only three HL (Higher Level) courses and strongly discouraged from taking more than four

Extended Essay (EE) and Creativity,

Activity, Service (CAS) All students are expected to produce a 4,000 word Extended Essay, which is a capstone project based on original research. Students must also complete 150 hours of Creativity, Activity and Service, including an extended service project that requires collaboration and leadership, and is focused on the local community. These IB requirements are in addition to their other coursework.

Co-Curricular Activitie

UAIS offers numerous extracurricular clubs and activities. Students wishing to participate in high school athletics or activities not offered at UAIS, may return to their attendance area high school. Participating in base school sports and activities requires considerable student initiative and represents a serious commitment

Covid 10 Accommodations

For semester 2 of the 2019-2020 school year, students received a credit (CR)or no credit (NC) for their course work due to the COVID-19 pandemic and the unexpected switch to online learning. These grades are not included in the GPA. The CR is earned if a student finished the semester with a grade percentage between 60% and 100% in the

Faculty

All faculty members hold a Master's, Specialis or Ph.D. degree. Faculty members have been extensively trained in brain/mind research in conjunction with the Caine Learning Institute of Idvllwild, California. Faculty members have also received special training in Reading Apprenticeship by West Ed

The UAIS grading system is based on a weighted 4.0 scale. Semester grades are based on a 40/40/20 model wherein each of two quarters counts for 40% of the final semeste grade and the exam counts for the remaining 20%. Grades are weighted (.50) for all courses that conclude in a national reported course exam (IB or AP). For winter semester 2020 students received CR/NC due to quarantine

International Baccalaureate (IB) Full Diploma Program Curriculum

The IB curriculum is at the heart of the UAIS. Modeled by the following diagram, the IB curriculum is comprised of six academic areas surrounding the threecore requirements. In order to meet the graduation requirements, set forth by the Utica Community Schools Board of Education and the Michigan Department of Education, students must complete 22 credit hours. UAIS students graduate with 32 credit hours.

The average number of students earning the IB diploma from the graduating classes of 2022 was 86%, which exceeds the world average for IB Diploma procurement. Of these students the average score was 30 points, with 24 points being the passing mark.
