

# How many credits should I have?

### FOR CURRENT SOPHOMORES:

Transcript should show AT LEAST 7 credits to be on track

EX:

+ 3 + 6 + 6 credits on your transcript now 2<sup>nd</sup> semester sophomore year junior year – both semesters senior year – both semesters Credits



#### FOR CURRENT JUNIORS:

Transcript should show AT LEAST 13 to be on track

- EX:
- 13 credits on your transcript now
- + 3 2<sup>nd</sup> semester junior year
- <u>+ 6</u> Senior year both semesters
- 22 Credits





## ALTERNATIVE COURSE SELECTIONS/OPPORTUNITIES

#### ADVANCED PLACEMENT

- Advanced Placement(AP) courses offer students the opportunity to take college-level course work while in high school.
- Earn college credit by participating in the AP exam in May.
- Earn a 0.5 GPA (grade point average) increase upon successful completion of the course.
- Explore CollegeBoard's <u>AP CREDIT POLICY</u> page to explore opportunities at each post-secondary institution.

### DUAL ENROLLMENT

#### DUAL ENROLLMENT - Postsecondary Enrollment Options

- Eligible high school students are provided an opportunity to enroll in college courses.
- The school district provides monies toward the tuition, mandatory course or materials fee or registration fees.
- Dual Enrollment classes replace classes within your high school schedule. The courses must go beyond the offerings within the UCS curriculum. Students must apply for Dual Enrollment through their counselor/school by May 1 for the fall semester.

# Alternates to certain graduation requirements

- A <u>Personal Curriculum</u> is an option to modify specific credit requirements and/or content expectations based on the individual learning needs of a student.
- Designed to provide students an opportunity who would like to accelerate or go beyond the Michigan Merit Curriculum requirements and for students who need to individualize learning requirements to meet the Michigan Merit Curriculum requirements.
- A <u>FLEX Option</u> is an option to modify the second year of a World Language requirement or the PE requirement.
- Any modification to a student's graduation requirements needs to be consistent with preparing a student for life after high school (Educational Development Plan) and applications must be submitted through the counseling department.
