



An email will then be sent on Friday, August 18 in the evening to those families who have completed their required forms. This email will include their student's first semester schedule and their assigned locker and locker combination.

- I will take good care of my assigned Device and accessories.
- I will keep my Device secure at all times.
- I will not loan my Device to anyone.


## \*7<sup>th</sup> Grade Technology Distribution

Utica Community Schools will provide a laptop to all secondary students. These devices that will be distributed to all seventh grade students on Monday, August 21 are an essential tool that will be used daily. You will find Malow's plan to distribute laptops for all seventh grade students below. In addition to being prepared to receive the laptop, we ask that students have all registration forms completed via PowerSchool. If you have not completed your online registration forms via PowerSchool, please bring the attached [computer agreement document](#) on August 21. If you have completed your online registration forms in PowerSchool, you do not need the hard copy. If you are unable to print the document, we will have printed copies in the front office or available on Monday, August 21. **Completion of this form in PowerSchool, or a signed hard copy, is needed to receive a laptop.** I am highly encouraging all parents to consider device insurance for your child's laptop. Last year we had numerous damaged devices that cost hundreds of dollars for families. [Click here](#) for more information on the Technology Device Insurance program.

On August 21, our seventh grade students will be asked to come to school to receive his/her laptop device and materials. This also includes students whose home school is Malow, but who have chosen to attend the UCS Virtual Academy this year. **PLEASE** be here at your allocated time (see below). Once at school, students will follow procedures that will allow them to receive the device and an information card, log in to their device, and make sure the devices are functioning properly and that they have access to all the UCS digital content including PowerSchool.

Once you have dropped your child off at our main entrance (**door 2**) at Malow (**see map below**), please proceed to the front parking lot where students will exit after they receive their materials.

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**\*Non-School Issued Electronic Communications Devices (UCS Student Handbook)**

The personal use of non-school issued cell phones or other electronic communications devices (ECDs) by students is prohibited at any time while in school or in a district vehicle. Students may carry ECDs during the school day, but they cannot be displayed or used without permission from a teacher or administrator for educational purposes. **Personal use of the device shall be limited to the time before and after the school day and only when students are outside the building. ECDs shall not be used during instructional time, lunch, passing time between classes or on any school bus without permission of a school official.**

During tests and assessments, cell phones/ECDs must be placed in lockers, backpacks, or another location away from students and their desks. Please see the UCS Student Handbook for ECD protocols during state testing.

If a student needs to place an emergency phone call during the day, they should request to go to the main office to use an office phone. If a parent needs to give a message to or speak with their child during the school day, they should call the main office.

If a student does not comply with the request to provide the staff member their cell phone for a violation, they could face consequences for insubordination/disrespect.

The use of an ECD's picture-taking or internet connection capability is not permitted without permission of a teacher or administrator.

Utica Community Schools will not be responsible for the theft, loss or damage of any ECD. Appropriate disciplinary action will be taken against students who violate the policy regulating ECDs.

If a student is found to be in violation of the above expectations, the following plan will be implemented:

**First Violation – Warning #1**

Cell phone/ECD will be taken to the office with first and last name of student.  
Student picks up phone at the end of day.

**Second Violation – Warning #2**

Cell phone/ECD will be taken to the office with first and last name of student.  
Malow office will contact the parent.  
Student picks up phone at the end of day.

**Third + Violation**

Cell phone/ECD will be taken to the office with first and last name of student.  
Malow office will contact the parent.  
Student picks up phone at the end of the day.  
Disciplinary Action per Administration.

Parents should call the attendance line to report all absences (586-797-3599). Attendance will be taken each hour. Tardiness will be tracked the same way as face-to-face instruction. ## Do You Drive Your Student to School?

Safety in our parking lot is our number one priority. We truly appreciate the patience and courtesy extended between drivers. Please continue to drive slowly and be aware of your surroundings. Our students do a great job complying with our rules in the parking lot, but we still need to be extremely cautious.

If it is necessary to drive your child to school, please use the outer lane for quick drop off of students while reserving the inner lane for thru traffic. Have your student exit the vehicle as **quickly** as possible. **Please do not wait until you are the first car in line before dropping your student off, and do not wait until your child is in the building before driving away.** The idea is to reduce the long line of cars coming into the parking lot in the morning by allowing several cars to drop off students at one time. Utica Community Schools is committed to promoting the safe and effective use of technology. A tool that families can use to help protect their children is the Michigan Child Protection Registry. This free service from the State of Michigan protects children's e-mail, cell phone numbers and Instant Messaging addresses from receiving inappropriate, adult-themed material. In addition, parents can click on the Protect MI Child icon, which will soon appear on the district and school Web sites for direct access to the registry.

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## Struggling Students

It is important to Malow counselors that ALL our students are successful. For students who may be struggling, we first encourage communication between the parent and the classroom teacher. If missing assignments are a problem, we encourage parents to try changing the question from, "Do you have homework tonight?" to "When will you complete your nightly study time?" Even on rare nights when no homework is assigned, all students will benefit from spending a minimum of 20-30 minutes each night reading textbooks, reviewing vocabulary flashcards, preparing for upcoming quizzes/tests, etc. If students don't bring home books and materials for this study time, parents can assign reading from a book at home, etc. Once students realize that their parents are serious about consistently enforcing a mandatory nightly study time on each school night (Sunday through Thursday), they will begin to bring home and complete their assignments.

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

