A MESSAGE FROM MR. CUCCHI



Good afternoon Titan community,

As the holidays are quickly approaching, the goal of our entire team is to allow our students to enjoy this time with family and friends. Use this upcoming holiday break as an opportunity to relax and unwind before we hit the ground running for the second semester on January 5, 2026. The entire Stevenson Staff would like to wish you a happy and safe winter break.

Mid-term exams will take place Wednesday, December 17 through Friday, December 19. The first exam will start at 7:15 a.m. and the 2nd exam will start at 8:50 a.m. Please note that all three days will follow a half-day schedule, with students dismissed at 10:19 a.m.

Exam Schedule:

Wednesday December 17: 1st and 2nd hour exams Thursday December 18: 3rd and 4th hour exams Friday December 19: 5th and 6th hour exams

Remember the final grade for the first semester comes from 40% of the 1st quarter grade, 40% of the 2nd quarter grade, and 20% of the final exam. Any combination of 2 Fs will result in a final grade of an F.

Students are encouraged to take advantage of Titan Time Tutoring on Tuesdays and Thursdays as well as any help their teachers offer.

Report cards will be available through PowerSchool on January 9, 2026.

There is no school for winter break from Monday, December 22 – Friday, January 2, 2026. Students return to school January 5, 2026.

This will be the final Titan Voice edition of 2025. We will continue to share important updates on our school website as needed.

Now that the weather is changing, please make sure you and your student plan accordingly so they can arrive to class on time. Students must be in their classroom at 7:15 a.m.

Counseling Updates – Stevenson Counseling Department just finished meeting with every student to complete their Xello lessons. Xello is a career interest survey for students. It helps them learn about potential career paths and lets them research colleges, scholarships, and in-demand jobs that may shape their future.

Stevenson is adopting families in need for the holidays. If you would like to contribute monetarily or are interested in purchasing gifts, please contact the Counseling Office.

For all senior families, please make sure your child has completed their FAFSA. Many students were able to create their FSA ID on October 7th at Stevenson, but many families still need to log in and finish the full FAFSA. If you have questions or need help, please contact your student's counselor. Lisa Hallam, a FAFSA specialist, will also be on campus December 15th to assist students with the FAFSA.

As we near the end of the semester, please help us support students in finishing strong. Keep in mind that each quarter is worth 40 percent of a student's grade, and the final exam counts for 20 percent. Exams will take place December 17th through 19th, and those days will be half days.

Scheduling for the second semester is underway. Students will not be able to change schedules for teacher or lunch requests. We do our best to place each student in the classes they selected, but rearranging schedules for specific teacher requests is not possible.

Students will be able to view their second semester schedule right before we return to school after the first of the year.

IMPORTANT Reminder that students <u>MUST BE ON TIME</u> to class. Excessive tardies may result in the loss of their parking permit.

Student Parking – Students could lose their parking permit for irresponsible driving, persistent disciplinary issues or accumulating 5 or more tardies. See the Titan Voice for more details.

Parking permits are issued based on availability and the student's attendance. All fines and fees must be paid prior to receiving a permit.

Attendance Area Update

Utica Community Schools is continuing to address long-standing issues with school attendance areas. The review is in conjunction with facility improvements across the district.

When reviewing attendance area configurations, safety, the age of the facility and enrollment trends are being considered.

Currently, the district's Enrollment Distribution
Advisory Committee (a standing citizens group with
representatives from each school that reviews
attendance areas) is assessing patterns for schools
that feed into Stevenson High School and continuing
its review of Henry Ford II High School feeder schools.
Also, portions of the Monfort and Flickinger
attendance areas are under review based on how
they are embedded or in close proximity to the
attendance boundaries of Dresden, Harvey and
Ebeling elementary schools.

The attendance areas under review are on the second page of this fact sheet. Changes to these attendance areas would be effective for fall of 2028–2029 in conjunction with facility improvements.

Overview

- Through the implementation of facility improvements, UCS is addressing complexities in attendance areas that were largely developed 50 years ago.
- Current attendance areas feature some neighborhood subdivisions geographically disconnected from neighboring communities and boundaries that do not take advantage of major landmarks and roadways.
- The facility review process includes a long-range facility improvement plan and consolidation of buildings.
- By improving select elementary schools and consolidating school attendance areas, UCS would create greater access for students to updated facilities that support growth and achievement.
- Schools are being evaluated based on three criteria: overall safety, age of the facility and enrollment trends for the school.
- Attendance areas currently under review include feeder schools to Stevenson High School and Henry Ford II High School. Consolidation may also impact students assigned to nearby areas that feed into Utica High, such as Monfort and Flickinger Elementary.
- Input is being received from the Enrollment Distribution Advisory Committee (EDAC), comprised of community representatives from each school.



Attendance Intervention Suite

Dear Parent or Guardian,

I am writing to inform you about an exciting new program we are implementing starting October 6, 2025. To enhance communication regarding student attendance, we will be utilizing **Attendance Intervention**, a PowerSchool product designed to streamline updates and alerts for families.

With Attendance Intervention, you will receive text messages and email alerts directly from teachers and school leaders, keeping you informed about your child's attendance in real time.

What makes Attendance Intervention unique?

- No Login Required: Messages will automatically be sent to the phone number and email address the school has on file for you.
- Direct Communication: Each message will come from a unique phone number associated with the sender. This direct line allows you to easily save the sender's number in your phone and reply directly to them, if desired.
- Absence Alerts: Families will be notified if a student is absent from school in a timely fashion.
- Say Goodbye to Language Barriers: Attendance Intervention translates text and email messages into more than 90 languages, based on the preferred language on file.

We are confident that this program will enhance communication and ensure we are all working together to support our students' successes. If you have any questions, please don't hesitate to reach out to the school office.

Stevenson High School Communication Process Flowchart

How to Effectively Communicate with Stevenson High School Officials

Parents are often discouraged when they attempt to communicate with school officials only to be referred to others <u>in order to</u> resolve a problem their child may be experiencing in school. To prevent that frustration, parents should become informed about the "Communication Process Flowchart." This sequence is in place to assist parents on where to begin their communication regarding their problem or concern.

Most parent and community questions are easily and completely answered by communicating directly with the staff member closest to the situation. As you move further along the flowchart, the staff is less directly involved and usually needs additional time to research the situation before they can give you an answer. If you do not hear back from the person you have contacted within two (2) business days, it is appropriate to reach out to them again before moving along to the next level of the flowchart. We do not expect your questions or concerns to go unanswered for a long period of time. Each situation should first be addressed at whatever level the initial action was taken with appeals moving on to the next level on the "Communication Process Flowchart." The easiest way to communicate is via e-mail while a phone call is the next preferable way.



School Safety and Security

School ID Badges Ensuring safety and security for all students and staff is a priority each day. In addition to enhancing security, the wearing of ID badges provides a professional setting and promotes College and Career Readiness for all students.

Wearing of IDs is required as part of many workplace environments, as well as on many college and university campuses. One student ID and lanyard will be provided to every student at no cost.

The benefits and reasons for students wearing a current student ID card are:

- To be in class
- To purchase lunch
- To borrow library books and textbooks
- To obtain early dismissal
- To allow movement during school, going to and from restrooms, etc.
- To be on campus before or after school
- To participate in school activities, assemblies, dances, etc. at school.

Student ID Guidelines

A student's ID card authorizes him/her to be on the school campus. EVERY student must wear his or her student ID card while on school grounds. It is crucial that the school staff can identify everyone on campus. The identification of staff and students is a safety issue and will not be compromised. Student IDs may be left in the student's assigned locker overnight to ensure the student ID is not left at home. The following guidelines must be adhered to when wearing student ID cards:

- 1. Student ID cards must always be worn and visible (i.e., not kept in a purse, pocket, or backpack).
- 2. The student ID card must be presented to any school staff member or person of authority upon request.
- 3. The front and back of the student ID card cannot be altered (i.e., no markings, other photos, etc.). Defacing or altering the student ID is prohibited.
- 4. Wearing another student's ID card is prohibited.
- 5. Lost, stolen, altered, damaged and/or defaced student ID cards must be replaced immediately.

Students who fail to adhere to the above guidelines are subject to a lunch detention (or after school detention) and a replacement fee of \$5.00 to replace a lost ID badge. Students can purchase a new lanyard from the school or purchase one on their own. Tear away lanyards are recommended. Students who are insubordinate or persistently disobedient are subject to further school consequences.

Attendance Policy

Another important reminder is to take time with your student to review the UCS High School Credit Review Rules and Procedures. In short, it starts by saying that a student has a responsibility to attend, be on time and prepared for each scheduled class. When a student nears or is at 10 absences (any combination of absences or tardies) they will meet with their Associate Principal and parents will be notified. When a student has accumulated 11 absences* in any one class over the course of a semester, the student will be notified in a meeting with an assistant/associate principal that they have lost credit in that class and that they are placed on an attendance contract to earn the credit back. There are two parts to a contract. First, the student must pass the class with a D- or higher. Second, the student will show improvement in attendance in ALL classes. Improvement is determined on a sliding scale which allows for 1 absence for every three weeks (rounded up) left in the semester for each class.

Please take the time to read and discuss this with your students, and make sure they understand.

Attendance and Early Dismissal Procedures

Please call <u>586-797-1999</u> and follow the prompts:

1 = Early Dismissals 2 = Late Arrival 3 = All Day Absences

<u>Please do not call the main office for attendance</u>. When an Early Dismissal is necessary, a PARENT MUST call in the dismissal before the student leaves. Otherwise, your student will be marked unexcused. Also, your student must check in with the Main Office before they leave campus to ensure their safety. PowerSchool is now generating automated phone calls to parents informing them of any absences for their students daily. Please use your Parent Portal to view your student's attendance.

If you have any concerns, email the individual teacher directly through the staff tab of the school's website or through the PowerSchool. If a correction is warranted, the teacher will request one. Our goal is to have call-ins recorded before the office closes for the day. However, if you have any questions regarding your student's attendance, please wait 24 hours to ensure that all records are complete and up to date.

PARKING PERMITS

Parking permits are issued based on availability and the student's attendance. All fines and fees must be paid prior to receiving a permit.

**Parking with no permit = stickered => Saturday School => Suspension

Sophomore Parking Permits Now Available – Sophomore permits can be purchased now and will be issued on a first-come, first-served basis.

Students must submit: A completed parking permit application, A copy of their driver's license, A copy of the current registration for each car listed

Application and copies should be submitted to Mrs. Johnston in the Associate Principal's Office. The parking application can be printed from the Stevenson website under "Parent Quick Links." Permits are \$75 and may be purchased through PaySchools Central, or by cash (exact change), check, or money order.

PARKING is NOT allowed by students and/or parents in the Court House/City Center parking lot, along Dodge Park Road or in the surrounding neighborhoods marked with No Parking signs. Dropping off students in this area is also not allowed.

ATTENDANCE PROGRAM

Parking permits are dependent on attendance. Students who have accumulated 5 or more tardies and/or Unexcused absences, will not receive their parking permit for the 1st five weeks of the school year. At that point, with responsible attendance, parking will be reevaluated for the school year. In addition, outstanding fees must be paid in full to be eligible for a parking permit. (Contact Remi Darroch, Bookkeeper, at remi.darroch@uticak12.org, 586-797-1903 for questions about your students fines.)

Reminder that students are expected to be in school on time. Parking Permits may be suspended for the following reasons:

- Excessive unexcused absences or tardies
- Careless or reckless driving
- Persistent disciplinary issues

Ä Please check your student's PowerSchool account 'Dashboard' for Outstanding fees. Outstanding fees should be paid immediately. Fee details can be viewed by clicking on **Site Map** in the upper right corner, then **Balance**, then **Transaction**.

- The most common fees are Replacement Student Ids* \$5.00 each, Replacement Lanyard* \$3.00, Senior Class Dues \$30.00, Junior Class Dues \$15.00, or Sophomore Class Dues \$15.00. *All students are required to have their School Id with them and visible while on school property. We provide each student their first Student Id and Stevenson lanyard free of charge. Students without their School Id are required to purchase a replacement ID, replacement Lanyards are also available.
- All fines can be paid via PaySchools Central: <u>click here</u> or on the <u>Stevenson Home</u> Page Hover over For Families, then Select: PaySchool Link.
- Fines may also be paid with Cash/Check/Money Order at the Bookstore window during school hours. If you have a question about your student's fees, please contact Remi Darroch, Bookkeeper, at remi.darroch@uticak12.org, 586-797-1903.

IMPORTANT: Students with outstanding fees/obligations cannot purchase Parking Permits or participate in Athletics and other extra-curricular activities, including August Titan Days, Homecoming and Prom until all fees/obligations are cleared or on a payment plan. Seniors with outstanding fees will not receive their diplomas until all fees are paid.

STUDENT DRESS CODE

Students must adhere to the guidelines outlined in the student handbook.

- Indecent, tattered, or unsafe dress or footwear, or attire that calls undue attention to the wearer or has lettering or symbols that are disrespectful or derogatory are not allowed.
- Beach wear, low-cut tops, tank tops, sleeveless tops, muscle shirts, see-through clothing, short skirts or shorts, pajamas, tight clothing without proper coverage and clothing exposing the shoulders or mid-section are not allowed.

Stevenson Counseling Department Newsletter

The Stevenson Counseling Department just finished meeting with every student to complete their Xello lessons. Xello is a career interest survey for students. It helps them learn about potential career paths and lets them research colleges, scholarships, and in-demand jobs that may shape their future.

Stevenson is adopting families in need for the holidays. If you would like to contribute monetarily or are interested in purchasing gifts, please contact the Counseling Office.

For all senior families, please make sure your child has completed their FAFSA. Many students were able to create their FSA ID on October 7th at Stevenson, but many families still need to log in and finish the full FAFSA. If you have questions or need help, please contact your student's counselor. Lisa Hallam, a FAFSA specialist, will also be on campus December 15th to assist students with the FAFSA.

As we near the end of the semester, please help us support students in finishing strong. Keep in mind that each quarter is worth 40 percent of a student's grade, and the final exam counts for 20 percent. Exams will take place December 17th through 19th, and those days will be half days.

Scheduling for the second semester is underway. Students will not be able to change schedules for teacher or lunch requests. We do our best to place each student in the classes they selected, but rearranging schedules for specific teacher requests is not possible.

Students will be able to view their second semester schedule right before we return to school after the first of the year.

Parents, please visit <u>mi.gov/ACHIEVEMENT</u> for details on the **Michigan Achievement Scholarship**. Many of our students qualify for this opportunity once they complete their **FAFSA**. All seniors that were in school on October 7th, did complete their FSA ID, however, parents need to complete their FSA ID as well. Once both the student and parent complete the FSA ID, FAFSA will notify families (usually within a few days) that it is time to complete the FAFSA.

The last week of October was full of daily activities celebrating our students' post-secondary plans. One highlight was the "I APPLIED" Wall, where seniors proudly signed their names and shared where they plan to go after graduation. The excitement was contagious—it's inspiring to see our students taking charge of their futures!

As we approach the end of the second quarter, please continue to check PowerSchool to stay updated on your student's academic progress. If your child is struggling in any class, encourage them to take advantage of Titan Time Tutoring, available after school every Tuesday and Thursday. NHS student tutoring is also available upon request—just reach out to the Counseling Office for more information.

Be FAFSA Form Ready: Create your StudentAid.gov account now

You and a parent need StudentAid.gov accounts to be FAFSA® form ready

The new 2025–26 Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA®) form is coming by Dec. 1, 2024. Submitting the FAFSA form is the first step to getting federal student grants, scholarships, work-study opportunities, and student loans. Who is eligible for federal student aid?

Make your form submission as easy as possible by doing two things. First, create your StudentAid.gov account now. Second, if you're under 24 years old, have your parent to create their account before December 1 as well.

- Create your StudentAid.gov account or make sure you can access your existing account by signing in to StudentAid.gov.
- If you're under 24, get a parent to create their account. <u>Check this chart</u> to confirm whether a parent or spouse also needs to have an account before you can submit your FAFSA form.

Having trouble? <u>Get answers to common questions</u> about creating a StudentAid.gov account.

What do I need to create a StudentAid.gov account?

- · Name (exactly as it appears on your Social Security card if you have one)
- · Date of birth
- Personal email address
- · Social Security number (if you have one)

Remember: You'll have only one StudentAid.gov account to use for the rest of your life, so make sure to use an email address that you'll have access to even after you graduate from school or change jobs.

How do I know if a parent or spouse also need to create an account?

- <u>Check this chart</u> to see whether any other contributors, like a parent or spouse, also need to create an account before you can submit your FAFSA form.
- If you're still not sure whether you need a parent to sign your form, confirm if you're an
 independent or dependent student.

If you're a dependent student, you (or your parent) can use the Who's My FAFSA Parent
wizard to figure out which parent, guardian or spouse also needs to create an account.

What if I don't have a Social Security number (SSN) or my parent doesn't have an SSN?

- · If you have an SSN, you must provide it when creating an account.
- All students must have an SSN to create a StudentAid.gov account unless you are from the Freely Associated States (Micronesia, Marshall Islands, or Palau). <u>Check eligibility</u> here.
- If you are a parent or spouse who does not have an SSN, you can still create a StudentAid.gov account to contribute to a student's FAFSA form. When creating your account, leave the SSN field blank and select "What if I don't have a Social Security number?"
- If only one parent has an SSN, that parent is the one who should create an account and join the student's FAFSA form as a contributor.

Note: if you get a message saying the SSN you entered is already in use when you try to create a StudentAid.gov account, make sure you entered the SSN correctly. If you entered the SSN correctly, then it's likely you created an account previously or someone else (such as a parent) created an account for you. Try logging in rather than creating a new account. If you have trouble logging in, try resetting your password or using another email address. You can also check with a parent to see if a StudentAid.gov account already exists for you. If you're sure an account has not already been created, contact the office of Federal Student Aid for more help. Do not attempt to use an ITIN or other value in place of an SSN for online account creation.



Stevenson Athletics Event Admissions Policy

- All students (home and guests) must present a school ID for entrance to the event.
- 2. Only high school students from UCS and the competing school shall be admitted without adult supervision.
- 3. All students must be seated in the upper bleacher area even if they are accompanied by an adult.
- 4. All junior high / middle school students must present a school ID AND be supervised by an adult. The adult must attend the event with the student and may not leave the student unsupervised.
- 5. All Stevenson Athletic events are entirely cash free. Presales on GoFan are the best and most efficient means of entry. Be advised that there is a \$1 service fee added to all ticket sales.
- In order to avoid fees, yearly athletic passes (student, adult, and/or family) can be purchased from the bookstore or athletic office.
- 7. All senior citizens (62+) and children under 12 (with an adult) are admitted free of charge.
- 8. All patrons must remain in the stands or concourse area. Only team and athletic department personnel are allowed on the sidelines, field or court. Please don't gather in door or aisle ways.
- Stevenson has a strict no re-entry policy, and no bags or containers will be allowed.
