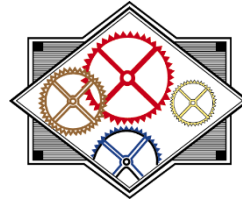

<b>ENGLISH 7 – B027</b>	<b>REQUIRED CLASS</b>	7	1.0 credit
This course emphasizes the development of the student's strategic reading skills, literary knowledge, writing abilities, oral language, and research skills. The study of grammar, along with literature, editing skills, and vocabulary, are taught as part of the writing process.			
<b>HONORS ENGLISH 7 – B127</b>		7	1.0 credit
Honors English covers the standard curriculum of English 7. The class will delve deeper into content by applying additional concepts to literature, independently reading additional novels, collaborating with others through discussion processes, and using critical thinking skills to analyze information. Students are expected to be independent and self-directed learners.			
<b>ENGLISH 8 – B028</b>	<b>REQUIRED CLASS</b>	8	1.0 credit
This course emphasizes listening, speaking, writing, and reading skills. The study of grammar, along with literature, editing skills, and vocabulary are taught as part of the writing process. Students develop reading skills through a study of drama, poetry, short story, and the novel.			
<b>HONORS ENGLISH 8 – B128</b>		8	1.0 credit

Students are expected to be independent and self-directed learners.			
<b>YEARBOOK – B658</b>		8	1.0 credit

**ENGLISH 9** (GR/MMC) (21F)– B020      **REQUIRED CLASS**      9      1.0 credit
